### **Position Title: Food Setup LM**

#### **Purpose:**

Food SETUP LM crew is responsible for either:

1 at SFU managing contract staff from a sole supplier agreement at SFU to place their product in the correct positions and providing adult supervision of the material distribution team and interface with the food supplier for the volunteers on the Material distribution team.

2. when the event is at UBC, moving cookies juice and snacks for 700 from cars to the Material distribution station Food set up will need several helpers the night before on a food purchase run. After The food set up is done this crew will go on to help the other set up crew with seat labeling. Volunteers may then go on to marking or invigilation after set up, or manage Contracted food services and lineups for lunch.

The Canadian Math Challengers is a sequence of written tests and a one-on-one verbal competition involving 600 to 1200 students in five venues in geographically separate areas of the Province of BC (the Lower Mainland, Fraser Valley, Okanagan, and Victoria regional competitions).

- Volunteers are expected to appear promptly on the competition day and will be trained onsite. Many volunteers including the younger ones have several years' experience.

### **Skills and Qualifications:**

- Almost no math must be remembered
- Ability to lift and carry boxes of stuff.
- Validation since there may be work with children, volunteers will be validated as members of: Engineers and Geoscientists BC, BCAMT, registered teacher or student enrolled in a host campus participating school or previous volunteer experience on record.
- Preprinted ID badges will be issued at volunteer registration at each event.

### **Eligibility and impartiality**

- Markers, Invigilators and MC's Must be Engineers and Geoscientists BC or BCAMT members, University and College Faculty or staff or enrolled at a University or College and must have no affiliation with a team that they are marking or invigilating.
- Material Distribution / runners must be over age 14 unless accompanied by a parent
- Completion of the Engineers and Geoscientists of BC volunteer agreement is desirable.

- **2 to 3 hours onsite**
